# **NOCA Competitions**

To enter in competitive curling events sanctioned by the NOCA, a curler must:

Be a member of, and have paid the approved NOCA per capita fee, to a curling club which is affiliated and in good standing with the NOCA;

Be a resident of Northern Ontario.

# Junior & Bantam Competitions

Junior - 20 years of age or under on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the National.

Bantam – 16 years of age or under on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the Provincials.

# Men's Competition

Men – 19 years of age or older on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the National.

# Women's Competition

Women – 19 years of age or older on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the National.

# Seniors & Masters (men & women)

Seniors – 50 years of age or older on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the National.

Masters – 60 years of age or older on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the National.

# **Mixed Competition**

19 years of age or older on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the National.

# The Dominion Curling Club Championship (men & women)

20 years of age or older on Dec. 31 of the year prior to the National with two players between 15–20 years of age allowed.

# **National/Provincial Affiliations**

The NOCA pays annual fees to both the Canadian Curling Association and the Ontario Curling Council. Some of the benefits of these member fees include:
