Police Record Checks

All NOCA coaches working with youth must have a Vulnerable Sector Check issued by their local police or OPP department. NOCA requires the coaches provide this documentation to the office, and that it be renewed every three years. This is also a good practice for clubs who have volunteers working with their Little Rock or Junior programs. There can be a fee for this service from the local police or OPP, and they may also require a form from NOCA or your club confirming that this person is working with youth. Road to the Roar Starts Tuesday

Getting Started in Curling for Adults

Many clubs across Canada have started new leagues for beginning adult curlers. These leagues are instructional and the format is based on a very successful program created by Earle Morris for the CCA. The program is designed to be held over an entire curling season and involves weekly lessons followed by curling. The entire program is available for download on the CCA website link below. <u>www.curling.ca/start-curling/getting-started-in-curling-for-adults/</u>. This site features a planning guide and video clips for instructors.

Starting a program like this might seem daunting, but it has proven to be very successful at many clubs. The program can be modified to suit your needs. One NOCA club offered the program last year and had 6 people sign up; that wasn't enough to start a league so the club got creative. The team was put into a regular league to fill a spot. The instructors met with the team 45 minutes before the start of the draw each week. They worked on a "lesson" for a half hour, took a 10 minute warm up break, and then the instructors stayed with them throughout the game. This year another new team joined so the club will again offer the modified version of the Getting Started program. By being creative, this club gained 12 new members. The team from last year returned, and there are 6 new members this year. (This club is in a town with a population of 2800 people, not in a large city centre).

Club that have offered this program find that they retain at least 85% of the new people the next season; the new curlers are confident with their skills and enjoy the game. The added bonus is that they often want to get involved with the club bringing new ideas and more people into the volunteer base at a club.

A trip to Sochi, Russia, and the right to wear the Maple Leaf in curling's most important event will be on the line when the 2013 Tim Hortons Roar of the Rings Canadian Curling Trials, presented by Monsanto, get underway on Sunday at the MTS Centre in Winnipeg.

The Trials competition format is a round robin, with the first-place teams advancing to their respective finals, while the second- and third-place teams meet in a semifinal to determine the other finalist. TSN/TSN2 and RDS2 will televise all draws, leading to the women's final on Saturday evening, Dec. 7 at 6:30 p.m., and the men's final Sunday afternoon, Dec. 8 at 2 p.m.

Northern Ontario's Brad Jacobs rink, the pride of Sault Ste. Marie, won the 2013 Tim Horton's Brier, claimed the silver medal at the 2013 World Men's Championship, and will now will compete against 7 other men's teams from across Canada for the right to wear the maple leaf.



The Horgan team (Jennifer Horgan, Amanda Gates, Jenna Enge, coach Louise Logan) will travel back to Soo Curlers Association to compete in the Ontario Scotties January 5-12, 2014. 
Travelers and Wheelchair Champions Declared:

NOCA Notes May 14, 2013

Board Meetings:

Last weekend, the NOCA Board and staff met for their annual in person meeting. Due to financial constraints, the rest of the board and committee meetings during the year are held via teleconference. The weekend consists of committee meetings, strategic planning, budget presentation and approval, and a board meeting. The committees that met were the competitions committee, development committee, and bylaws and policies committee.

The **Competitions Committee** reviews events, entries, officiating, and other items related to competitions from both the current season and the last few seasons to identify any trends or concerns, and to make recommendations to address these items. *Changes to the competitions formats are attached.* The competition schedule for next season will be posted on the website today.

The **Development Committee** reviews the programs and services currently offered, and create a development plan for the next season. One of the key items that came out of this meeting was the creation of a committee to create guidelines and a "toolbox of ideas" for any club wanting to host a Youth Challenge. The development interns (positions created in a Trillium Foundation grant) provided a presentation outlining the work they have done this year in particular as it related to the development of curling for Aboriginal youth and adults. The interns are currently creating a member services manual that will be available to all clubs in the fall.

Curling Week in Northern Ontario was also discussed and it will be held November 16 – 24, 2013.

The **Bylaws and Policies Committee** continues to work on updating our policies to comply with the Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act. As well, the implementation plan for the restructuring of the NOCA Board which will take place next April was reviewed.

The Board and staff also spent a half day reviewing the **2011-2016 Strategic Plan**. The result of the review as that action items will be identified with measurable outcomes defined that the Board can review for progress on a monthly basis.

The **Budget for 2013-14** was presented, discussed, and accepted by the Board. The budget presented for this fiscal year is a balanced budget (no deficit or profit). The year end financials and budget notes will be presented during the Annual General Meeting.

One of the exciting ideas that will be developed during the next few months will be the creation of a 16 month NOCA Calendar. This calendar will be available for clubs to sell as a fundraiser. More details will follow as work on the calendar progresses.

Region meetings:

Each club has a NOCA club delegate who is responsible for acting as the liaison between NOCA and their club. Each region has 2 meetings a year, one in the spring and one in the fall. These meetings are scheduled for the next couple of weeks. Your regional directors will be reviewing last year and discussing next year so if you have any questions, please contact your regional director.

Annual General Meeting:

This year the AGM will be held via teleconference. Anyone is welcome to participate but you will be asked to pre-register so that you can be issued the dial in numbers. The only voting delegates at the AGM are the NOCA Board members, but participating and discussion by anyone is encouraged. Watch the website for more information. All club delegates will receive the information via email.

The date and time for the Annual General Meeting is Monday June 24th at 7:30 pm ET.







Competitions Information 2013-14 Season

General Information:

The 1st place versus 2nd place championship final at provincial championships, with an undefeated team having to be beaten twice has been eliminated. Instead there will be a semi-final between the 2nd and 3rd place teams, with the winner to play in a final game against the 1st place team. The format for regional competitions and open provincials will continue with one change – 8 teams will play a round robin, with triple knockouts starting at 9 teams.

Men's format:

The provincial will be an eight (8) team round robin followed by a semi-final between the 2nd and 3rd place teams, with the winner to play the 1st place team in the championship. Three teams will qualify out of each of the East and West Qualifiers, with two teams coming from the CTRS points standing as of Dec. 31st (must be in the top 75 teams). Teams can enter one or both qualifiers which will be held on different weekends two weeks apart in January. In 2013-14 the West qualifier will be held first followed by the East qualifier (the provincial championship is also being held in the East). Deadline for the second qualifier will be 48 hours after the first qualifier has been completed. Three game days will be eliminated unless tiebreakers are necessary.

<u>Bantams:</u>

The provincial will continue to be an eight (8) team round robin followed by a semi-final and final. Six teams are eligible to qualify out of regional competition (one team per region) which will be moved ahead to December. Two Challenge Rounds will be held, one East, one West, on the previously scheduled Region weekend, with one team of each gender advancing out of each to the provincial.

<u>Seniors:</u>

Seniors will continue to play 10 end games until such time as the CCA makes a change at the National level. Three game days will be eliminated, unless tiebreakers are necessary. Since fifths are not allowed at the National Championship, fifths will not be allowed at the provincial. Teams can either use the spare pool or play with three players.

The Dominion Curling Club Championships:

The deadline for clubs to register their intent to send a team to the regional playdowns has been moved up to January 17, 2014. Regional playdowns must be completed by March 9th.

Entry Fees:

Entry fees will remain the same. Any team that plays in the first Men's Qualifier or Bantam Regions will have the opportunity to play in the second Men's Qualifier or one of the Bantam Challenge Rounds. Entry fee will be \$100 as long as three (3) players from the original team advance. If less than three (3) players on a team advance together this will be considered a new team and the entry fee will be the same as the initial entry fee (\$260/team for men + the CCA Competitor fee, and \$150/team for Bantams)

Competitor Guides:

Guides for all levels of competition will be available on the NOCA website by November 1st. Please ensure you have the most recent addition before your team competes as changes are sometimes made after the original guide is published.
