Brad Jacobs' rink (Jacobs, Ryan Fry, EJ Harnden, Ryan Harnden, Coach Caleb Flaxey) from the Community First Curling Centre in Sault Ste. Marie are the 2016 Travelers NOCA Men's Provincial Champions and will represent Northern Ontario at the Tim Hortons Brier March 5-13 in Ottawa.

The Doug Dean rink (Dean, Gino Sonego, Chris Provenzano, Lola Graham, Rick Bell, Coaches Doug Gelmich and Mike Bergquist) from the Fort William CC earned the 2016 NOCA Wheelchair Provincial title in Kenora last weekend.
