New this year:

- The Bantam events will now be called U18 and athletes under the age of 17 as of June 30, 2016 are eligible to compete. There is now a Curling Canada U18 national championship to be held April17-22 in Moncton NB.
- Junior competitive events will now be called U21 and anyone under the age of 21 as of June 30, 2016 is eligible to compete.
- The top two CTRS points earners in the Men's division will earn automatic berths into the Traveler 2017 NOCA Men's Provincial Championship.
- Curling Canada has adopted a Sweeping Moratorium. NOCA will release a statement about the moratorium and how it will affect NOCA Competitions next week.
