New Charitable Tax Receipting Program for Ontario Curling Clubs Launched:

Does your club have a financial plan for building or equipment upgrades or a new program?

The Ontario Curling Council and its members, Curl ON and NOCA have endorsed the National Sport Trust Fund – Ontario as a revenue generation program through which donors can receive charitable tax receipts for qualifying donations. Information

Clubs can fundraise for infrastructure, equipment, programs – anything that supports the National Amateur Sports System. Bonspiels, dinners, golf tournaments are all great ideas to raise funds for your project and the National Sport Trust Fund – Ontario has tools to help clubs do so and still meet all charitable tax requirements. Donors of goods and services may also be eligible for tax receipts.
