


Other Courses

- Level 2 Officiating: the next step in Officiating designed for people who want to become Chief Umpires at competitive events



RONNEBECK: Coach Training & Coaching Symposium

At times coaches may feel isolated when they face issues within their teams or haven't had opportunities for development themselves. Coaches often spend countless hours developing and encouraging their teams and may feel they have few chances for personal growth.

The Ontario Curling Council is offering webinars with various professionals on a variety of topics throughout October, November and December. There are several interesting sessions coming up.

October 21 – More on Brushing

Glenn Paulley will be speaking about brushing and the latest technology, training methods and findings related to equipment and technique. Glenn and his colleague John Newhook have measured over 600 high performance athletes

including U18, U21 and U25 age groups. Glenn provided this description:

"In this talk, which I call "Building a Brushing Strategy", I will explore the idea of building a brushing strategy for a team. The talk is largely targeted at U18/U21 coaches and athletes. We will look at brushing techniques, normative data, gender differences, energy pathways and fitness, and some additional ideas and tools that coaches can use to improve the brushing performance of their teams."

October 25 – 5 Rock Rule Forum

Pat Simmons, Canadian Champion, will be answering questions and facilitating a discussion about the 5 rock rule. This rule has been in place now for about a year and coaches and athletes may have specific questions about situations they and their teams have faced with the change. This will be a very interactive session with the mics open the whole time for discussion.

November 7 – Curl Coach 2019

This webinar is extremely useful if you been using Curl Coach for a while and want to get more out of the tool. In this session, Stephen Orr, the developer of Curl Coach will share some of the updates to the app that were added since the last

webinar. There are new features and Stephen will share with you some best practices related to how to get the most out of Curl Coach.

November 20 – Emotional Intelligence and How it Affects Coach Leadership

This webinar will discuss the importance and value of Emotional Intelligence and how it is applied to Coaching Leadership. The webinar will address how vision statements and coaching philosophies are connected to emotionally intelligent coaching leadership. There will be tips on enhancing your emotional intelligence.

Leith Drury, PhD, is a sport psychology consultant for the CIS teams at Ryerson University and a learning facilitator with the Canadian Sport Institute in Ontario.

Leith has worked with national and international calibre athletes from a multitude of sports.

December 5 – Curl Coach and Statistics

Stephen Orr, the developer of Curl Coach will share a general approach on how stats can be used (and misused), how to understand the wealth of data that is available and focus on those things that are most important for a team today, with some specific examples, and anecdotes to make the whole thing more

approachable.

ROWAN'S LAW AND SAFE SPORT

As reported in the September edition of NOCA News, Rowan's Law now has mandatory requirements for all sport clubs. Effective July 1, 2019, Curling Centres are LEGALLY required to comply with the following immediately.

Rowan's Law (Concussion Safety), 2018 makes it mandatory for sports organizations to:

- 1. Ensure that athletes under 26 years of age,* parents of athletes under 18 and the athletes, coaches, team trainers and officials confirm every year that they have reviewed Ontario's Concussion

3. Establish a Removalfrom-Sport and Return-to-Sport protocol. ** (The rules for removalfrom-sport and return-to-sport protocols are expected to be in place by July 1, 2020).



DOUBLES CURLING

Looking for something new to try at your club? Doubles Curling is quickly growing as a new league/event at many clubs.

Doubles Curling is a fast paced game where two players form a team. A game takes just over an hour and moves very quickly with no standing around.


The basic rules are that each twoperson team delivers five (5) stones per end. The player delivering the team's first stone of the end must also deliver the team's last stone of that end. The other team member shall deliver the team's second, third and fourth stones for that end. The player delivering the first stone can change from end to end. Many clubs are now offering Mixed Doubles or just Doubles Leagues and are finding that this new event is attracting younger players, many of them new to the game. One NOCA club held a "Learn about Mixed Doubles" after the 2018 Olympics, and had 12 people participate. The club offered an evening league last season and had 12 teams register.

Only one team also played on a regular league night so it didn't hurt the participation numbers in other leagues. The Doubles League attracted 20 new curlers to the game, most of whom had never curled before.
