PREAMBLE

The Northern Ontario Curling Association has adopted the <u>Canadian Anti-Doping Program</u> (CADP).

By adopting the CADP, the Northern Ontario Curling Association has joined a world-class antidoping program that is designed to protect athletes' rights and ensure a level playing field. The Northern Ontario Curling Association's anti-doping policy reflects and supports the CADP.

POLICY

The Northern Ontario Curling Association has adopted the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP). As part of the Northern Ontario Curling Association, all members are subject to Canada's anti-doping rules. The CADP involves seven core elements; Jurisdiction, Athlete Services, Education, Testing, Sample Collection, Results Management and Intelligence & Investigations. The CADP consists of several components such as in- and out-of-competition testing, education, medical exemptions, and the consequences of doping violations, and is compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code and all international standards.

Important Information

The CCES recommends that athletes take the following actions to ensure they don't commit an inadvertent anti-doping rule violation:

Doping Control

- Review the <u>sample collection procedures</u>.
- Know your <u>anti-doping rights and responsibilities</u>.
- Always comply with a testing request if you are notified for doping control.

Prohibited Substances & Methods

- <u>Check all medications and products</u> before taking them to ensure they do not contain ingredients that are banned in sport.
- Verify your <u>medical exemption requirements</u>.
- Learn about the <u>doping risks associated with supplement use</u> and how to minimize them.
